The North London Waste Authority (NLWA) no longer wants to process black bin bag waste at Pinkham Way.

BUT

The NLWA is still determined to build what we calculate could be a very large waste plant on the Pinkham Way site, a 16-acre Grade 1 Nature Conservation area in Haringey.

- **Road congestion and air pollution**

Barnet Council still plans to move its entire fleet of bin lorries out of Barnet (London's second largest borough) to Pinkham Way in Haringey. This could add more than 1,000 vehicle movements per day to an area already suffering serious gridlock and air pollution.

- **Fight against planning permission**

Although the NLWA bought the Pinkham Way site outright, it has no planning permission and our job is to ensure it never gets it. This means concentrating pressure on Haringey Council to help us protect the site.
